The Black Art of Weather Forecasting

Have you ever wondered what all those peculiar lines on the weather chart mean? Do the Met Office use it to play darts???

The Editor and I thought that you might like to know a little bit more about the relationship between the pictures on the television and what is happening outside your window....


Generally speaking, a low pressure system (or depression) moves from West to East and you will see gradually lowering cloud base (stratus / layer clouds) with rain steadily increasing until the **Warm Front** arrives.

The Warm Front is marked by a noticeable clockwise (veer) shift in wind direction, a rise in air temperature, and muggy, misty, damp or drizzly weather.

Eventually, depending mostly on wind strength and the depth of the

depression (weather and mental!), the wind veers noticeably again and the weather clears quite quickly to become colder and clearer with sharp showers.

The cross section below shows what an observer would see as a system passes through:-



(Ed's Note: For those that do not know, my intrepid author of this & wild life articles used to be in the Fleet Air Arm (apologies in advance if I have got it wrong) hence I believe his final paragraph (above right).

The "Black Art" itself is immensely complex because there are so many factors involved from the shape of local hills to the amount of water in the reservoirs, from the crops in the fields to the pollution in the air....

Meteorologists are trying to use computers to identify previous similar weather patterns assuming that the same weather will follow this time – but there have been some spectacular errors!!

When our expert came in to give us our morning briefing, he was confronted with a large piece of seaweed hanging from the deckhead and the demand "have you looked outside?"



Two Seasonal Recipes

Apple and Redcurrant Jelly

Chocolate Apple Crumb

(extremely easy and works with any apples).

1kg cooking apples 1 kg redcurrants (or blackcurrants) Approx. 500g jam

Roughly chop the apples (no need to peel or core) and add to a large preserving pan with the redcurrants. No need to top and tail.

Cover with water (just) and bring to a gentle simmer.

Continue cooking until the fruit is soft. Note you can use frozen fruit directly from the freezer. Just heat gently and add water as need to cover as they thaw out.

Tip mixture into a jelly bag or into a sieve lined with a cloth suspended over a bowl and leave to drain overnight. Hint: don't squeeze the bag if you want clear jelly. Also if your fruit is too dry it won't strain so make sure it all looks 'mushy' before you start straining.

The next day, measure out your juice and pour back into a clean pan. Add 450g sugar for every 600ml of liquid. Gently dissolve the sugar. Then turn up the heat and boil for about 10 minutes. Test for a set by placing a small amount of jam on a fridge-cold saucer and placing the saucer back in the fridge. After a minute, gently push the jam with your finger. If it forms a skin, it's ready. If not boil for another few mins. Err on the side of a soft set.

Immediately pour into clean, warm sterilized jars. Easiest to warm them in the oven. Once the jam is cold, screw the lids tight and keep in a cool place until opened. Generally, when opened, jelly is best kept in the fridge.

A regular Community Magazine contributor has suggested that we start a Poetry Group. Knowing that we have several budding authors living amongst us I am sure that many of you will be able to submit something in relation to the 'Beautiful Local Countryside' we are privileged to live in. Here is one to get you going:

"I wandered lonely round Thorpe Cloud Past fields and trees and footpath signs When all at once I came upon A field of blooming dandelions". 1kg apples 30g butter

For the Crumb Topping:

125g crushed digestives
50g soft brown sugar
100g dark or milk chocolate
roughly chopped
75g melted butter
1 tablespoon golden syrup



Stew the apples in a saucepan with the butter and a splash of water until they begin to soften a little. Then transfer into a pyrex dish or similar.

To make the topping, mix the crumbed biscuits, sugar and chocolate and scatter over the apples.

Melt the butter and syrup together and then pour over the crumb topping

Cook in a 190C/Gas 5 oven for about 30 mins until the apples are cooked and the topping is golden.

Note this is super easy and can be prepared in minutes. You could also use breadcrumbs instead of the biscuits and I have made it with half the amount of sugar and syrup and it was still good.

After being closed for many activities for some weeks, the Hall is now open for bookings, subject to adherence to government guidance. The Post Office is open twice a week at lunchtimes (Mondays and Thursday) and the Pilates class has re-commenced (contact Victoria at pilatesinthepeaks@gmail.com). We were delighted to host the MacMillan Coffee Morning last month, which was enjoyed by those who felt comfortable attending this wellorganised event, where safety was paramount. Understandably, however, several of our regular community users are not yet confident to re-start, so hire income will be greatly reduced this year.

Please note that as a community facility complying with COVID-secure guidelines, the 'rule of six' does not mean that only 6 people may attend activities; only that people attending must not do so in groups of more than six.

(Generally, people arrive as couples or on their own.) Groups must be socially-distanced and avoid 'mingling' (yes, that word appears in the legislation!). Capacity limits in the main hall are reduced and the meeting room is not available for use by more than 3 people at a time. Also, with limited exceptions (such as fitness classes or whilst eating/drinking), face coverings need to be worn.

In other news... the Hall car park has been re-surfaced and looks very smart, with marked bays and cycle stands (to encourage people to cycle to the Hall if they can). The project was well overdue but has had to wait until funds permitted. We were pleased to receive a grant of £10,000 from the National Lottery Fund, which played a part in our decision to make this much needed investment despite the financial uncertainties that all village halls face in these difficult times.

The Council last met on 8th September. Significant points of their discussions are:

- To celebrate the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War II, it is proposed to get some poppies decorations for the lampposts in the village.
- The possibility of also getting a memorial seat will be investigated though this will depend on the council receiving a bonus for switching banks.
- County Councillor, Gill Heath, is investigating how much can be done within her budget to provide more double yellow lines and improved Dovedale signage around the village

- The congestion caused by cars queuing for Dovedale Car Park, when it is full, has become quite dire with it sometimes causing delays of an hour and a half to get through from Thorpe to Ilam. The Council are contacting the County Council, our MP and the car park owner to try to find a solution.
- Cars are still parking in the Dovedale Coach Lay-by but County Council traffic wardens are unable to ticket them as it is private land owned by the Peak Park. Meanwhile Peak Park do not have the manpower to enforce the restrictions. The Council will ask Peak Park to give the land to them so they can take care of things.

The next meeting will be held on 10<sup>th</sup> November.
