

## Private John Lomas

John Lomas was born in the last quarter of 1871 in Fawfieldhead, nr Longnor, Staffordshire. He was the fourth child of Elias (1845-1903) and Elizabeth (nee Beresford 1844-1915) Lomas.

His siblings were Annie (born 1868), Lydia (born 1868), Herbert (born 1870), George (born 1873) and Isaac (born 1878)

In the first census record for John in 1881, he is living at the Cottage, Fawfieldhead, Longnor, with all the family apart from his 2 older sisters. His father was a Farm Labourer.




On 29 January 1917 he had a medical which records that he was 5' 7½" and weighed 141lbs. He was mobilised on 12 February 1917 into 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Prince of Wales's (North Staffordshire Regiment) and posted on 16 February 1917. He was sent to North Yorkshire for training.

John died on 7 March 1917 in the Military Hospital Redcar, whilst training. According to army records he was 41 years of age. He had only been called up 23 days previously. The cause of death was acute bronchitis.

He is buried at Christ Church Coatham Redcar.
