
The Committee would like to thank everyone for contributing to make it a fun occasion.


St. John's Church mixing young people still at school with older people who are more vulnerable, and nobody wants to contract Covid just before Christmas when they are hoping to get together with their families. The Village was out of power for four days at the beginning of December which was a nasty shock to those who weren't living here in the 1980s when outages were quite common and we all had oil lamps and generators. The problem was much worse than usual because the overhead cables became coated in ice and the strong winds from an unusual direction caused not only the cables to swing and touch but also brought down both supporting poles and trees' branches – we even had a helicopter hovering right outside the house attempting to blow some debris off the overhead lines!

On the fourth night the team working around Elkstones said that they were going to work on through the night until the power was back on – and so they did, restoring the power at about 10 pm. They said that every time they cured one fault, they found another.

To end this year on a more positive note, we wish you all a very Happy Christmas and Peaceful and Healthy New Year in 2022 - let's all hope for better things!
