

MoorLands

Homemade Popcorn.

A very cost-effective snack that goes a long way. A 400g bag of popcorn costs less than a pound and this recipe uses 60g and feeds 6 easily. I found this online and apparently it came off the back of a packet at some time in the past.

Heat 3 tablespoons coconut or olive oil in a pan. Put 3 or 4 of the popcorn kernels in the pan and wait for them to pop. Take the pan off the heat, tip in the rest of the popcorn, shake to an even layer, cover and leave OFF the heat for 30 seconds.

Put back on the heat and wait for the popping. Keep moving the pan around and open the lid just a tiny fraction to release steam. When the popping stops, divide the corn between two large bowls. To one bowl, add a teaspoon of sugar. To the other a teaspoon of salt. Shake them both about and serve. The coconut flavour is enhanced as it gets cooler. I'm sure you could use other flavours or just leave plain.

LEADEN BOOT CHALLENGE: Alstonefield Village and Milldale

The Leaden Boot Challenge long distance walk will be held on May 22nd 2022. The playing field carpark opens at 7am and the race commences from the centre of the village at 9am. Entrants will go down Millway Lane to Milldale where they go past the toilets, over the Viator Bridge and up Baley Hill. There will be marshals on the road and it is expected that everybody will be through by 10am.

The first finisher will arrive back at Alstonefield Village Hall at approximately 1.20pm and there will be a steady stream of first runners, then walkers on the road up until possibly 9pm. The competitors will approach Alstonefield across the fields and down the track from Green Farm. The last stretch up to the VH is on the road.

Everybody is most welcome at the Village Hall throughout the day when food and drink will be available but particularly to welcome back the Leaden Boot participants.

Alstonefield and District RVS Friendship Club

After a year of lockdowns and staycations, Friendship Club re-opened in July 2021. The club has been running for 64 years serving all the villages in the Alstonefield area. At its height, there were over 60 members. Although numbers have dwindled in recent times, we still gather 20 plus people at most meetings from all around the local area.


