

Message From The Community Bus Shelter



The Butterton Bus Shelter opened after the winter, and the shelves and tables have been full with books and bric-a-brac. The big news is that we are now a charity. Over the last three years donations made to local and international causes and purchases for village amenities exceed £8,300. From now on as a charity, this will be more transparent, and have continuity. We are named the 'Butterton Community Giving Charity', and have four trustees. We have published the finances from 2020 until we became a charity on the village website

(http://buttertonmoorlands.co.uk/village-organisations/butterton-bus-shelter/).

We will keep you updated on this over the coming months.

During April we collected for the Disasters & Emergency Committee relief for the appalling tragedy of the earthquake in Turkey and Syria, where 50,000 lives were lost and millions made homeless. We have a number of causes suggested by you which were reviewed by the trustees of the new charity. Among them we have selected two which we have not donated to before and that have a true local impact: Mountain Rescue and the Air Ambulance. They will be our chosen causes for May and June. Please continue to suggest causes for future months.

Many people have asked us to advise on levels of donation. We strongly encourage you to make a donation for anything you take. Prices in charity shops have increased – a sign of the times. To help there is a list in the Shelter suggesting amounts which we consider to be reasonable. Soon, we hope to make it easier for those without cash to make donations.

As previously, we invite you to leave books and bric-a-brac in the Shelter.

Please make sure items are CLEAN and intact.

Electrical or Mechanical items should work (label them 'WORKING ORDER'). We will be obliged to remove anything which is inappropriate or potentially dangerous.

PLEASE don't leave:

Clothing, knives, paint, anything flamable or toxic. DVDs & CDs

Jam jars, egg boxes, out of date travel books, encyclopeadias etc.

Butterton History Group

We are moving into the modern era by commencing to digitise our documents. Not easy for someone who has spent most of her life teaching Key Stage One children!

We are still working hard to transcribe the mid seventeenth century documents recently acquired from Stafford Archives relating to Butterton Mill. Sampson Stubbs is the 'main mover' but The De Wrottesley Family have crept onto the radar. Therein lies a connection with Waterfall and the family living there in the late thirteenth century. Butterton is not a Doomsday Village and interestingly doesn't feature in Volume V11 of the Staffordshire Victorian Histories series of books. The earliest mention of Butterton's beginnings that have been found to date is in 1254 when a religious presence was established. This is now proving to be an exciting time, filling in some gaps and is proving to be fascinating whilst uncovering some useful facts.

The AOF Banner is on the move. It will shortly be on its way to Derby where a potential restorer will have a look at

it and hopefully come up with some ideas for its preservation. Watch this space.

The History Group event 'All we know about St Bartholomew's Church' that was reported in the last issue of the magazine as being in June, will now be in October. We are asking for copies of any Butterton Church weddings for our display.

To all you happy snappers.....We are holding a photographic competition with thirteen lucky winners seeing their photos in a 2024 calendar. We still have to refine details with the printers but we are asking for landscape photos of our beautiful village, not family shots. We think digital photos would be better but the real thing will be acceptable too.


