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

Message From the Community Bus Shelter (& Eric)



The Bus Shelter re-opened after the winter break just in time for the deluge at Easter. Despite this, we have had a great start. You have left a tremendous range of items which have come (and gone) from the Shelter. The book shelves have been well supplied. Unfortunately the item in the blue box is for display purposes only (Eric is his name). We have done amazingly well in April; the funds raised by our charity from direct donations and the Shelter and are on track to exceed £600, which is incredible considering the terrible weather throughout the month.

We are collecting towards the costs of creating a Memorial Garden in the church. As the church funds are very limited, this project can only be achieved by

fundraising. We expect to have news on the costs and the timescale for the project by early summer. We will keep you informed. In the meantime, we have made a donation of £250 to support Wetton resident Mandy Hudson on her way to raising £6.5k for the Brain Tumour Charity. Many of you will be aware of the background to this.

Over the coming period, we also plan to give grants of £250 to organisations which can have a direct impact on the lives of villagers. These are Buxton Mountain Rescue, West Midlands Air Ambulance and Manifold Pre-School.

It is lovely to see all the wild flowers beginning to grow in the valley, with the bright gold colour of the lesser celandine and the swathes of white wood anemones currently in bloom, and bluebells just coming out. Wood anemones grow in ancient woodland and often in churchyards, and we are lucky to have a very good spread of them flourishing in the ancient woodland on the hillside down the valley. The migrant birds are also coming back after wintering in warmer places, and wheatears have been seen along the drystone walls and fences along the top road, where Don Sutherland of Elkstones recently took the fabulous photograph of the one pictured below. While we have all complained about the immense amount of rainfall that we have had recently, we are sometimes rewarded with a rainbow afterwards,

like the one that seemed to be wrapping itself round Doris and Andrew Wentworth's House, Hill Farm, Butterton, as seen in the equally wonderful shot also featured, taken by Paul Furness of Butterton. Thank you for the photos, Don and Paul.

The flowers mentioned above can be seen in abundance at the moment in the churchyard, especially in the wild area in the lower half, and make a lovely sight. Having said that, we do need to keep the walkways in the upper part of the churchyard clear, so that people can access the graves, and we are looking for any volunteers willing to give the access routes in the top part the occasional strim. There is no set rota – any offer to do this now and then, at your own convenience, is welcome. Please let Myrtle Alcock know (01538 304225) if you can give a little of your time occasionally to do this.

I'm pleased to say that all of the children had a wonderful Easter break and we all thoroughly enjoyed hearing all about their adventures! As always, we have lots of fun to report on despite having only been back for three weeks!

Upon our return, we warmly welcomed two new pupils to the school and immediately set about our learning with two exciting trips. The Squirrel and Hedgehog classes ventured off to Mrs Goldstraw's farm to support their learning about animals and to complement their study text in English, 'Woolf' by Alex Latimer. The children had the most amazing morning feeding and holding the animals, whilst learning all about what it takes to farm successfully. History Live!

The Earth Below our Feet: The Geology of Chrome and Parkhouse Hill & the surrounding areas. Presented by Dr Andrew Smith

Wednesday May 1st at 7.30 (doors open 7pm) Warslow Village Hall, SK17 0JL

For our final talk of the season, we are really pleased to welcome Dr Andy Smith to History Live. Andy's presentation will look at the geological setting for this spectacular part of Derbyshire; the geology and make-up of the rocks in the vicinity, and what this can tell us about the local environment during the period these rocks were being deposited. The talk will also cover the mining and mineral heritage, past and present, as well as some of the techniques anyone can use to read the signs in the landscape to better understand what is happening below your feet.

Andy is an Industrial Mineralogist by training and has worked in the field for his whole career. He is currently Head of Materials Development with Forterra Building Materials Ltd and an Associate Professor at the Centre for Mineral Products at the University of Derby. His interest in all things geological stems from his childhood, being born and brought up between the western edge of Sheffield and the Peak District and spending many happy days hill walking with his father across the Peaks.
